Home Learning Pack

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Daily Learning</u></p>  <p>Reading Eggs is an online resource for all children. TTRocks is for Y3-Y6 and Numbots is for EYFS-Y2.</p> <p>The weblinks are in the <i>Home Learning</i> booklet and passwords are in your child's home learning pack.</p> <p>Teachers have also suggested some things to do as often as possible in a similar way to school e.g. reading, writing, spelling and number challenges.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Theme Project</u></p> <p>Teachers have planned a theme project that is in line with learning for this term.</p> <p>For most themes there are Oak National Academy lessons to learn more about the theme.</p> <p>There are also BBC Bitesize links and project ideas.</p> <p>The knowledge organiser can be used to learn important words, facts and definitions.</p> <p>We are looking forward to sharing your theme projects.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Knowledge Organiser</u></p> <p>You have a knowledge organiser in your <i>Home Learning</i> booklet.</p> <p>You can use the knowledge organiser to learn important facts and help with your theme project.</p> <p>We will be using knowledge organisers in school too.</p>
