### A guide to our Home Learning offer – Spring Term

- a balance of new learning and opportunities to apply and revisit learning
- regular contact with school staff about learning

#### **Daily Learning**







**Reading Eggs** is an online resource for all children. **TTRocks** is for Y3-Y6 and **Numbots** is for EYFS-Y2.

The weblinks are in the **Home Learning** booklet and passwords are in your child's home learning pack.

Teachers have also suggested some things to do as often as possible in a similar way to school e.g. reading, writing, spelling and number challenges.

#### **Theme Project**

Teachers have planned a theme project that is in line with learning for this term.

For most themes there are **Oak National Academy lessons** to learn more about the theme.

There are also **BBC Bitesize links** and project ideas.

The **knowledge organiser** can be used to learn important words, facts and definitions.

We are looking forward to sharing your theme projects.

You have a knowledge organiser in your Home Learning booklet.

You can use the knowledge organiser to learn important facts and help with your theme project.

We will be using knowledge organisers in school too.
