INTRODUCTION

This annual governance statement covers the period 1st August 2014 to 31st July 2015. In this annual statement "governing body" is taken to mean, "The Governing Body of Newby & Scalby Primary School."

CORE STRATEGIC FUNCTIONS

In accordance with the Government's requirement for all governing bodies, the three core strategic functions of the governing body are:-

- 1) Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction;
- 2) Holding the Headteacher to account (being a critical friend) for the educational performance of the school and its pupils;
- 3) Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure its money is well spent.

GOVERNANCE ARRANGEMENTS

The Governing Body of Newby and Scalby Primary School was re-constituted on 29th June 2015, and is now made up of fourteen governors as follows:-

- a) Five Parent governors;
- b) One Local Authority governor;
- c) One Staff governor;
- d) Headteacher;
- e) Six Co-opted governors.

The governing body has a number of committees which meet regularly and focus on specific areas of governance. These committees/meetings are as follows:-

- a) Full governing body;
- b) Strategic Overview committee:
- c) Finance and Human Resources committee;
- d) Pupil performance committee;
- e) Premises committee (ad hoc sub-committee of Full Governing Body, meeting as necessary and annually for a premises inspection).
