Event	Details
Carrying coats and bags around school.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• After half term, we will be asking the Year 6 children to carry their coats and bags with them around school in preparation for their move to secondary school.</li><li>• Your child will need a <u>small</u> bag with them, a rucksack would be perfect, so that they can carry such things as: their reading book, packed lunch (if they need one) and homework.</li></ul>
Sports' Days	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Year 6 will design and plan, but not deliver, sports day events for all year groups.</li><li>• The delivery of these events will happen during PE lessons by PE staff.</li></ul>
Bikeability	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Bikeability is planned to happen the <u>week beginning 14<sup>th</sup> June</u>.</li><li>• Covid restrictions at the time may mean this can't go ahead so please prepare your children for potential disappointment.</li><li>• More information to follow.</li></ul>
Year 6 production	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• The plan, as it currently stands, is to go ahead with a filmed version of the play.</li><li>• On the back of this letter is the part of the script we would like to use for auditions. If your children would like the chance of a main role or line, please prepare this with them. We'd love to hear them sing a song too just in case singing is allowed.</li><li>• Covid restrictions at the time may mean the play can't go ahead so please prepare your children for potential disappointment.</li></ul>
Dalby Forest	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Normally, at the end of the year, we take Year 6 on a trip to Dalby where they do teamwork and problem solving activities. We hope to do the same this year if restrictions allow.</li><li>• More information to follow.</li></ul>
Year 6 transition day	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• If your child is transferring to Scalby, Graham or St Augustine's, <u>Friday 9<sup>th</sup> July</u> is penciled in for them to spend the day at their new school.</li><li>• More information will be sent from your child's secondary school about details of the day.</li></ul>
