

Daily Maths Activities

Have a go at some of these activities each day.



Roll your dice **ten times.** Which numbers are **odd**? Which numbers are **even**? Record in a table.

Roll your dice **twice** to make a **twodigit number** e.g. 46 What is **one less** than the number? What is **one more** than the number?

Roll your dice and record the number e.g. 4 What do you **add** to **make 10?** e.g. 4 + 6 = 10

Roll your dice twice to make two numbers e.g. 3 and 5 Which number is bigger? e.g. 5 is bigger than 3. Roll again. Is that number bigger or smaller? Can you arrange them on a number line?

Roll your dice twice to make a two-digit number e.g. 12 Roll again. e.g. 6 Can you add or subtract those two numbers? e.g. 12 + 6 or 12 - 6

Roll your dice twice to make a two-digit number e.g. 54 Can you count on to 100? Can you count backwards to 0?

- Is it less than 70?

Missing number.

Ask someone to cover a square. Can you work out what the missing number is?

Numbers in words.

Pick a number. Can you write it out in words? e.g. 24 = twenty four
