

Year 1

Class 1A & 1S

WOW! What a great first week back year 1 has had!

In English we have started a new unit all about the Magic Porridge Pot. We have been discussing different types of magical objects and what the children most desired if they had the opportunity to be granted a wish. In other news both 1A and 1S had an unexpected visitor to their classroom last night. A dragon from a magical faraway land visited and breathed fire on our carpet and screen. Luckily, nothing was spoiled!

In Art we have started looking at what sculptures are. We looked around the classroom for different objects and designed a home made sculpture that they described as a light house at the sea side.

In PE, we have started a new unit called 'playing games,' to develop our understanding of listening to rules and learn why it's important to work as a team.





Class 2S & 2MT



During half term our chrysalises turned into butterflies! We loved looking at the pictures of them being released and have been trying to spot them on the playground.

We have a new strategy read which we are excited about 'George's Marvellous Medicine' by Roald Dahl. We learnt about the author and made predictions of what might happen in the book based on the front cover this week.

In writing we completed our 'cold task' and have focused on using adjectives to describe a setting. We also started text mapping our new text 'Jack and the beanstalk.'

We have enjoyed practicing our racket skills in PE and worked on developing our accuracy and working with a partner to earn points.

In maths we have also started a new topic on shape.



Class 3C & 3WR



This week in English, we have been exploring one of Joseph Coelho's poems—"Something Wondrous." We didn't just read the poem—we brought it to life! Using some of the strategies Coelho himself uses, such as changing tone, using hand gestures, and playing with pace and volume, we had a go at performing it ourselves.

In Reading, we began our new Strategy Read, *Charlotte's Web* by E.B. White. We used the front cover and blurb to make predictions about the plot, characters, and themes.

In PE., we have enjoyed learning about fielding skills in rounders and cricket. The children have developed their underarm and over arm throwing techniques, focusing on accuracy, power and team work.





Class 4S & 4M

Year 4 have made a great start to the Summer term! We have begun our new reading book for this term called Krindlekrax. We have been starting to look at our new writing topic: defeating the monster. In maths, we have been looking at time: remembering our time facts, telling the time and time durations.

We have already begun our new history topic about the Ancient Mayan civilisation and have a D&T topic about sewing and a science topic about sound to begin this term. In PE, we have started our cricket topic, focusing on fielding.

It was lovely to welcome the children back to school this week. We had lots of news and stories to share with each other!



In maths, we are learning to estimate and classify different angles e.g. right angle, acute, obtuse, reflex and have been practising our full, half and quarter turns, clockwise and anti-clockwise.

Our new History unit has seen us learning about how democracy came about in England and we experienced it first hand with a lively debate and a virtual visit to the Houses of Parliament where we learned about the Houses of Commons and Lords and the different coloured seats!




