


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Class 0C & 0S

This week we have been busy creating artwork inspired by our new artist 'Lowry'. We used charcoal to draw stick figures just like Lowry and used pastels for the background, we considered different tones. We found out that Lowry often draws and paints busy cities. We used famous buildings in and around Scarborough to create our own masterpieces.

We used adjectives to describe the characters and setting for our Talk for Writing story - The Teeny Weeny Tadpole. Next week we will begin to innovate the story and create our own versions.

In maths we have been using the language First, Then and Now to add and subtract. Maybe you could have a go at adding and subtracting at home e.g. First I have 10, now I have 3, how many were taken away?



Year 1

Class 1A & 1S

What a lovely week year 1 has had!

In Science, the children have been monitoring the growth of their seeds that they planted last week! They were all surprised how much their plant has grown in less than a week!

During PSHE, we have looked at different types of greetings people can do to one another. The children then walked around the classroom and greeted their friends in as many different ways as possible.

In English, we have just completed our boxing up for our story the 'Magic Porridge Pot' ready to innvote in the next few days!

In Geography, the children have been looking at what the coast is and what type of natural materials they could find if they were there. The children had the opportunity to use their senses by standing on pebbles, sand and crushed shells to enable them to describe the different textures.






Class 2S & 2MT

What a busy four days! In history this week we compared what housing conditions were like for the rich and the poor during the Victorian era. In Science, we observed what happened to our plants from last week and then planted our own bulbs or seeds.

In maths we have been counting faces, sides and vertices of 3D shapes. Can your child remember the names of the 3D shapes we have been looking at?

We enjoyed going on a nature hunt outside as part of our computing lesson and then inputted the data on our iPad to create a pictogram with the results.

In writing we have planned our own innovation based on Jack and the beanstalk and focused on using prepositions in our writing. We loved reading some more of George's marvellous medicine (ask your child what Grandma's voice is like) and learnt how the author uses ellipses to build suspense...



Class 3C & 3WR

Even though this week was a little shorter due to the Bank Holiday, Year 3 have certainly made the most of their time with lots of exciting learning!


In Design and Technology, the children explored how pulleys and levers work. They investigated whether all pulleys and levers need the same amount of effort to move a load – and made some interesting discoveries!

We also spent time learning about VE Day in our class assemblies. To mark 80 years since the end of the war in Europe, the children made bunting and enjoyed a special picnic on the field – a lovely way to remember and celebrate this important moment in history.

In Science, we completed our experiment on friction. We learned that bumpy surfaces create more friction, while smooth surfaces, like plastic, create less friction and make it easier for objects to move.

Although only a four day week we have managed to cram in so much exciting learning.

We have been busy in English thinking about a defeating the monster story. The children have now planned their own ideas and we have started writing our ideas down.

In Maths we have focused on area which the children have all shown a great understanding of.

In science, we have been focused on sound and thinking about how sound is made and how it travels. We have been busy experimenting with cups and string and using tuning forks to see how this vibrates some water.

Well done to those children who attended the MTC club this week. It was great to see them so enthusiastic to improve MTC scores.

Class 5G & 5BT


We have had an incredibly busy four days but thankfully cooler too!


