EYFS

Class OC & OS

This week we have continued to create artwork inspired by the artist Lowry. The children have learnt how to use pastels and charcoal to create their own art with Scarborough buildings as inspiration. In music, we have continued to read the story 'Blown Away' and sung a song inspired by the book. We have lots of performers in both classes!

In maths we have explored shape, we have looked at how shapes can fit together to create tangrams. We have used vocabulary such as; rotate and complete to make our own shape pictures.

In phonics, most children have continued to read longer words with the 'ed' ending. Next week we will re-assess the children. They will then hopefully recieve a book with more challenging words.





Year 1



Class IA & IS

This week in Art, Year 1 have been getting their hands messy and creative with clay! We've been exploring how to shape and mould clay to create natural sculptures, inspired by Richard Shilling. The children have shown fantastic focus and imagination as they practiced different techniques, ready for their big clay sculpture project next week. We can't wait to see their final creations!

In English, we've been busy boxing up our innovation of the story of The Magic Porridge Pot, getting ready for our exciting hot write.

In Maths, we've been exploring measurement and length—comparing, ordering, and using language like longer, shorter, and taller. The children have worked so hard this week!

As the weather changes and layers come off during the day, please make sure your child's jumpers and cardigans are clearly named to help us return any lost items quickly.

Year 2

Class 25 & 2MT

This week we completed our innovated write and practiced using tools from our toolkit in our stories! We designed our own monster today in English which will be the inspiration for our 'hot write' next week.

In history we learnt about the jobs of Victorian children - lots of us were very interested in the rat catcher! In RE we continued our learning about special days and explored how Muslims celebrate Eid al-Fitr.

In art we learnt about our knew 'important person' Kazimir Malevich and looked at how he had use primary/secondary and warm/cold colours in his paintings. In PE we enjoyed working on our fielding skills trying to beat our opponent to collect all the beanbags.

Year 3





Class 3C & 3WR

In science, we explored the fascinating world of magnetism, a noncontact force. The children were amazed to discover that the Earth itself is a giant magnet! We learned the terms repel and attract, then had fun experimenting with bar magnets to see these forces in action.

Our exploration of Ancient Egypt continued this week with a focus on the famous archaeologist Howard Carter. We examined different viewpoints and carefully considered what the evidence from King Tutankhamun's tomb and mummy can tell us. The children shared some brilliant ideas and asked thoughtful questions — true historians in the making!

The children have truly impressed us with how much their cricket skills have developed this term. We've seen some fantastic batting and brilliant fielding on display. Watch out, Team England — we've got some rising stars in the making!





Year 4

Class 45 & 4M

This week, Year 4 have been writing their innovation 'defeating the monster' stories. We have really focused on our speech punctuation and keeping it interesting by using "speech sandwiches" and including their actions as they were speaking. In maths, we have been exploring Perimeter and area further, concentrating on rectilinear shapes. In reading, we have continued to get to know the characters within our book, Krindlekrax.

In PE, we have continued to work on our batting and fielding in both rounders and cricket.

Our unit in history has looked at Mayan religion and farming this week. We weren't keen on the sound of the cocoa bean hot chocolate with chilli flakes or the mushes maize bread.
